Genres will include:

Poetry – The City of London & A City for the Few

Art & DT

Spring 1: Structures Design a Playground

Intended Skills:

- Design a playground that meets user needs
- Choose and use materials and tools safely to build structures
- Test, improve and strengthen their designs
- Explain how their playground meets the design criteria

Spring 2: Art

Painting and Mixed Media – Artist Study

Intended skills

- Explore the work of a chosen artist and their techniques
- Experiment with painting and mixed media to develop their own style
- Plan and create original artworks inspired by the artist
- Reflect on and improve their work using feedback

RE

Spring 1: Galilee to Jerusalem

Intended Skills:

Understand: Pupils learn about Jesus' ministry in Galilee, his teaching through parables and miracles, and how these reveal God's love, forgiveness, and the coming of God's Kingdom.

Discern: Pupils explore why Jesus travelled to Jerusalem, the meaning of his death and resurrection, and how these events show Christians that Jesus brings salvation and new life.

Reflect: Pupils consider how Jesus' example encourages believers to make loving, just, and compassionate choices in their own lives today.

Spring 2: Prophecy and Promise

Intended Skills:

Understand: Pupils explore the events of Lent, Holy Week and Easter through St John's Gospel, from Jesus' temptation in the desert to his Resurrection in the garden, learning about sacrifice, love and redemption.

Discern: Pupils examine key symbols and beliefs, including the Last Supper, Jesus as the Paschal Lamb, the Crucifixion, and the meaning of blood and water as signs of new life and the birth of the Church.

Reflect: Pupils reflect on discipleship through Lenten practices such as prayer, fasting and almsgiving, considering how Jesus' life, death and Resurrection inspire hope, service and love for others today.

Spanish

Learning focus: Greetings and introducing yourself

Intended Skills:

- Understand and use basic greetings and farewells in Spanish
- Ask and answer simple questions about name, age, and how you are
- Pronounce greetings, questions, and responses clearly and accurately.
- Use polite expressions appropriately
- Recognise formal and informal language and apply it in context.

Maths

Decimals

- Read, write, order, and compare decimals to three decimal places.
- Round decimals to the nearest whole number or specified place value.
- Add, subtract, multiply, and divide decimals accurately.
- Convert between decimals, fractions, and percentages.
- Solve real-life problems involving decimals.

Fractions, Decimals and Percentages

- Convert between fractions, decimals, and percentages.
- Compare and order fractions, decimals, and percentages.
- Solve problems involving equivalent FDP.
- Apply FDP knowledge to real-life contexts (e.g., money, measurement).
- Recognise and use percentage increases and decreases.

Area, Perimeter and Volume

- Calculate the perimeter of 2D shapes, including irregular shapes.
- Calculate the area of rectangles, triangles, parallelograms, and composite shapes.
- Calculate the volume of cuboids and other prisms.
- Solve real-life problems involving area, perimeter, and volume.
- Convert between different metric units (cm^2 , m^2 , cm^3 , m^3).

Algebra

- Use letters to represent variables and unknowns.
- Write and simplify algebraic expressions.
- Solve simple one-step and two-step equations.
- Identify patterns and sequences using algebraic notation.
- Apply algebra to solve word problems and reasoning tasks.

Music

Learning focus:

Your child will continue to develop their understanding of melodic and rhythmic phrasing in music lessons and singing worship.

Science

Learning focus: Light

Intended skills:

- Learn that light travels in straight lines and helps us see objects
- Explore how shadows are formed and how their size and shape can change
- Investigate how light reflects from mirrors and other surfaces
- Understand how refraction changes the direction of light
- Use scientific enquiry skills to plan investigations, make observations and draw conclusions

Learning focus: The Circulatory System

Intended Skills:

- Learn about the main parts of the circulatory system and their functions
- Understand the role of the heart, blood and blood vessels in transporting oxygen and nutrients
- Explore how exercise, diet and lifestyle affect the human body
- Learn how healthy choices support physical wellbeing
- Use scientific enquiry skills to ask questions, make observations and explain findings

Computing

Spring 1 Learning focus: Search Engines

Intended Skills:

Pupils will develop the skills to use search engines safely, choose relevant keywords, evaluate results, and decide which information is reliable.

Spring 2 Learning focus: Big Data Handling

Intended Skills:

Pupils will develop the skills to organise, interpret and analyse large sets of data, spotting patterns and drawing conclusions to answer questions.

Learning Focus: Football

Intended Skills:

- Develop control and confidence when dribbling, passing and receiving the ball in different situations
- Use a range of attacking and defending skills and make simple decisions in game play
- Improve accuracy and power when shooting and scoring
- Understand and apply rules, positions and tactics in small-sided games
- Work with others, communicate clearly and show teamwork and fair play during matches

Learning Focus: Athletics

Intended Skills:

- Develop running, jumping and throwing techniques with control, accuracy and coordination
- Plan and pace themselves in different events, applying tactics and improving performance through practice

History/Geography

Spring 1 – History

Topic: What is the legacy of the Ancient Greek civilisation?

Intended skills:

- Learn where Ancient Greece fits within world history
- Explore what life was like in Ancient Greece, including democracy, daily life, beliefs and warfare
- Compare different city-states such as Athens and Sparta
- Use historical sources to ask questions and find out about the past
- Understand how Ancient Greece has influenced life today, including government, sport and culture

Spring 2 – Geography

Topic: Why do oceans matter?

Intended skills:

- Learn why oceans are important for life on Earth
- Explore how oceans affect climate, weather and food chains
- Find out how people use and depend on oceans around the world
- Understand the impact of pollution and climate change on oceans
- Consider how individuals and communities can help protect oceans

RHE

Module: Created and Loved by God

- Explore what it means to be created and loved by God.
- Understand the importance of valuing themselves in relationships.
- Learn about religious understanding, body and health, emotional wellbeing, and life cycles.
